

Most Christians are familiar with Jesus' prayer in John 17 that all believers would be united as He and the Father were One.

Looking around at the Church today, few would suggest Jesus' fervent desire had been fulfilled. Instead, we see the body of Christ broken into thousands of pieces—shattered is not too strong a word—and hampered from carrying out its mission by disunity.

Merely wishing things were otherwise will not change them. Ecumenism as a concept is tainted with the sense that it involves watering down the gospel. All too often, ecumenism seems to suggest replacing the atoning blood of Jesus with a touchy-feely social doctrine, long on political correctness but short on truth! But the staunchest of believers also fall into error. Some American Christians subconsciously adopt the position that our faith never existed before the last one hundred years . . . and only in the US, at that.

Dr. Lawton's work, <u>Behind the Shattered Church</u>, powerfully and effectively answers the question, "How did this fragmentation happen?" Even more importantly, where are there fundamental points of agreement if we are to ever succeed in answering the Lord's assertion that it is by unity that His church will be known?
