





A Conversation with Jed Snyder

How did your experiences as a "missionary kid" play into the writing of this book?

While just a teen in Bolivia I was given responsibilities that rival what adults usually do. One was to care for chickens and pigs. We also had a huge garden to feed the faculty and students at the boarding school. So from a very early age I was able to get a good sense of animal and plant husbandry.

So how long have you been keeping a "backyard garden?"

Well, this question might sort of reveal my age, but let me just say that I have had backyard gardens everywhere we have lived after marriage with the exception of the first year when we lived in an apartment.

What do you enjoy most about gardening?

That is a tough question but let me say that the feel of warm moist dirt in my hands in early spring is great. But the best, I guess, is eating that first juicy, red tomato directly from the vine.

What lessons have you learned from your garden?

That is exactly what this book covers. I am humbled by the grace of our Lord that he would have a seed grow in dirt into a comparatively large plant with fruit we can eat to sustain our lives. What an awesome God we serve!

Why should others think of you as an expert in gardening?

I don't consider myself an expert, but rather an observer and a person with lots of questions. The answers to many of these along with life applications have helped me and I trust others will be equally helped by my book.

What would you want for readers of your book?

It would delight me if at least two results were experienced. One, of course, is that readers will apply these lessons in their lives and be encouraged. The second is that they would have a new or renewed joy in their own backyard garden.

Will you be writing other books of similar genre?

Yes, I have written a book entitled <u>A Guide to Recognize Your Spiritual Gifts.</u> The special distinction of this book as contrasted with others on the gifts, is that I also talk to the fleshly and satanic counterfeits.

Some preachers have their sermons transcribed and a "ghost writer" makes them into a book. Is this what you have done?

No, this book is "from scratch." While the truths in it have been in many of my sermons, no sermon or lesson I have given comes directly from this book. It is new, fresh and, I believe, will be very helpful to the reading Christian public. I hope thousands of copies are sold, precisely because it is written to lift the body of Christ.
