

Suggested Interview Questions For Joshua A. McClure, author of On Broken Pieces

A: As a member of the older group, I have come to realize there are few books addressed to the particular needs that come with age.

Q: Why write a book about pain and suffering?

A: My personal experiences have led me to share with those desiring release from the prison of despair to the land of hope and freedom.

Q: Now that you are over 50, has your view of suffering and dying changed?

A: I feel the same way as I did when I first met Jesus. The cross does answer all the important questions for me. Nothing has changed in how I feel about death and dying because nothing has changed in how I feel about Jesus.

Q: When we enter the golden period of life, what is our chief contribution to society?

A: Wisdom. Do not fix your eyes on what is seen. Fix your eyes on what cannot be seen, for the things we cannot see will last forever.

Q: What encouraging words would you offer to widows, widowers, those dealing with pain and loss, the chronically ill, the despondent, and the dying?

A: Never give up. Though our bodies are dying, our spirits are being renewed every day, in preparation for eternal life with Jesus. Hold on to the cross, hold on to the shed blood of Christ, and you will make it through. God will be with you until the end.
